On Saturday morning May 18, the East Falls Historical Society will reprise one of its most successful events, an architectural-historical guided walk down Wissahickon Avenue from the Queen Lane Station to Oaks Cloister, concluding with an inside tour of the house and studio, courtesy of the owner, Dr. Russell Harris. Oaks Cloister, built in 1900, was designed by, and the home of, Joseph Miller Huston, architect of the Pennsylvania Capitol. The spectacular interior, originally created by artists and craftpersons who worked on the Capitol, is now the product of over fifteen years of meticulous restoration, enhanced by a collection of beautiful artwork consistent with the period when the house was built.
